The Gender Justice Barbershop This Way...

The design behind the Gender Justice Barbershop was to create multiple engagement points that were small and boutique that aimed to build relationships with students & staff to the project and those who were invited to act as "guest" mentors were carefully selected and briefed. (She is not your rehab & Matt Brown and Nas the Streets Barber)

These pop ups were also about building connection to our bigger and more sustainable and evidenced based program/model – Working Together with Men to support recruitment for allies and start "spreading the word" of the masculinities focus for RMIT across both HE & VE.

200 students were engaged overall - attended pop up or surrounds & spoke directly with staff and engaged on topic
100 students - received a haircut and one on one experience of 20/30 mins with a social justice barber!





